Indigo dyeing Workshop & Japanese Umbrella

Kyoto Shibori Museum

Sashiko Museum

Sashiko, "little stabs", is a Japanese traditional form of decorative reinforcement. This museum is dedicated to modern sashiko artist Akie Sakamoto. The museum itself is very valuable to see. An old house build over 200 years ago was moved to location and remodeled.



Shishu Restoration Studio

The Kyoto Shishu Restoration Studio is dedicated to repairing embroidery and traditional cloth pieces. The Studio is operated by Wakosha, a cleaning company that specializes in Kimono for Buddhist monks.



Misuya Needle

Misuya Needles are a special quality of needles produces by Japanese needle shop Misuya Chubei.



Kubota Itchiku Museum

Kubota Itchiku was a Japanese textile artist who devoted his life in recreating Tsujigahana, a fabric dyeing technique from 15th century. Since that technique was forgotten, he revived the lost art and modernized it at the age of 60. Most of his beautifu crafted kimonos are exhibited in the museum overlooking a stunning Japanese garden.
